TREASURES OF DOTHAN

Whether you're interested in learning about agricultural history or visiting Dothan's monuments and parks, the city boasts a wide range of museums, landmarks and statues that stand as a testament to the unique history of the Wiregrass region. From 19th- and 20th-century farming techniques at Landmark Park and Todd Syrup Farm to the U.S. Army Aviation Museum's extensive memorabilia and aircraft exhibits, you're sure to learn something new while touring museums in the Dothan area. For visual art enthusiasts, the Wiregrass Museum of Art offers collections that feature renowned Alabama artists. Those fascinated by fission power will enjoy interactive exhibits at the Farley Nuclear Plant Energy Education Center dedicated to the science of nuclear energy.

When you're ready to head outside, Dothan offers plenty of ways to experience the city's culture while enjoying the beautiful weather. Start with a visit to the smallest city block in the world, stroll past dozens of murals, then explore the Joseph Monument to learn more about Dothan's founding.

At several of our museums and monuments, you'll learn why Dothan is famous for peanuts. Tour the collections and exhibits at the George Washington Carver Interpretive Museum to learn about his life, legacy and his research in the development of the peanut. Before leaving, you'll want to find Visit Dothan's headquarters, which features the original Peanut Around Town, a gold-cast monument that represents Dothan's agricultural history.

WIREGRASS WOODTURNERS



MUSEUMS & ATTRACTIONS

The Dothan Area Botanical Gardens is an oasis that serves as a jewel of natural beauty. Spread across 50 acres of meticulously landscaped grounds, this botanical haven captivates visitors with its diverse collection of plant species and exquisite gardens. It offers a delightful escape from the hustle and bustle of daily life, where individuals and families can immerse themselves in nature.



The gardens feature a wide array of themed areas, including an enchanting Rose Garden, Wings of Wonder butterfly exhibit, and several art sculptures. These curated spaces offer a unique blend of artistry and nature, educational exploration, and photo opportunities. This is a must-see stop for both locals and tourists seeking inspiration. The gardens also host educational programs, events, and activities, a testament to Dothan's continued commitment to celebrating the great outdoors.

MUSEUMS AND ATTRACTIONS

Discover Dothan's museums and monuments, where threads of history and culture intertwine, offering a captivating window into the city's dynamic heritage and contemporary life.

Before closing its doors in 2014, E.R. Porter Hardware was the longest running hardware store in the state of Alabama. The store has been preserved just as it was when they closed business on that day, and stands as a living museum for "the way things used to be." The story goes that Dothan was built with materials purchased at Porter Hardware. This attraction is unique to Dothan and is full of stories about our little corner of the world.

E.R. PORTER HARDWARE MUSEUM

Located in the original Greyhound bus station downtown, the George Washington Carver Museum is dedicated to honoring the contributions of African-Americans to arts and sciences. The Carver is home to one-of-a-kind personal items from Dr. Carver and his laboratory. He developed over 300 uses for peanuts in food, industrial, and commercial products, as well as promoting soil rotation, which saved the Wiregrass area from economic ruin in the age of the boll weevil. The Carver hosts annual Black History Month events, as well as educational activities year round.

GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER INTERPRETIVE MUSEUM



Landmark Park is a 150-acre park built to preserve the natural and cultural heritage of southeast Alabama's Wiregrass Region. At the park, you'll find the state's only Agricultural Museum, a 1890's farmstead, complete with farmhouse, farm animals, smokehouse, cane mill, and blacksmith. Drift back in time through the general store where you can enjoy an old fashioned float or shake, one-room schoolhouse, and Victorian-era church. Take a stroll on the boardwalk



and visit the Interpretive Center, which includes daily planeterium shows. Landmark Park also hosts monthly and annual events, summer camps, and traveling exhibits.

LANDMARK PARK

What better way to celebrate our area's rich history in agriculture, music, movies, and peanuts than by painting it on the sides of our most historic buildings downtown? Beginning with the Peanut Mural on the side of Liddon Furniture in the Dothan Civic Center parking lot, these murals have been a loved attraction in Dothan for years. The best way to tour the murals is walking the downtown streets on a beautiful Southern day. Free printed maps are available at Porter Hardware and at the Visitor's Center. Or you can check out our website visitdothan.com for a digital map.

MURALS OF THE WIREGRASS

Originally housed in the original water and electric plant for the City of Dothan, the Wiregrass Museum of Art has been collecting and exhibiting contemporary art since 1988. Explore 18,000 square feet of carefully curated visual arts, with a focus on Alabama artists. Exhibits rotate frequently, and WMA hosts Art After Hours, wine experiences, , film screenings, art camps, educational tours, and favorite annual events such as The Glass Pumpkin Party. It's never the same experience twice at the Wiregrass Museum of Art!

HISTORICAL LANDMARKS

Dothan is home to several landmarks that reflect its rich heritage. The Cherry Street African Methodist Episcopal Church, organized in 1877, serves as a poignant reminder of the local African American community's contributions. Additionally, the Naming of Dothan Statue commemorates the city's origins, paying homage to its biblical namesake and the significance of its founding. These are just a few of the many landmarks that offer a glimpse of Dothan's past and its enduring cultural significance.

From honoring the contributions of women and industries like turpentine and lumber to commemorating music legends such as Ray Charles and Hank Williams, each mural adds a unique dimension to the cultural landscape. Additionally, murals depicting Fort Rucker and the historic Cherry Street AME Church offer further insight into the city's rich heritage, inviting visitors to explore and appreciate its diverse legacies.

DESOTO'S JOURNEY THROUGH THE WIREGRASS REGION

Hernando Desoto's exploration party traveled on the east side of the Wiregrass in 1540.

THE ABDUCTION OF ELIZABETH STEWART DILL

A Creek Indian attack on a supply boat and the subsequent abduction of Elizabeth Stewart Dill.

CAMP RECOVERY

An army rehabilitation camp near the Chattahoochee River and Fort Scott for the War of 1812.

MULES IN THE WIREGRASS

How the use of mules instead of oxen improved the farming and logging industries in the area.

FORT SCOTT: PROTECTOR OF THE WIREGRASS

Fort Scott was poised at the Flint River, and housed future presidents Andrew Jackson and Zachary Taylor.

JOHNNY MACK BROWN

"The Singing Cowboy" Johnny Mack Brown was a Dothan native before appearing on the Hollywood big screen.

CHIEF EUFAULA: CREEK INDIAN REMOVAL

Chief Eufaula lobbied in the Alabama statehouse before leading the last of the Lower Creeks to a reservation in Oklahoma during the Indian Removal Act.

THE DOTHAN RIOT

In October of 1889, just after Dothan was incorporated, a riot erupted at the public well and bell tower over a tax levied on commercial drays.

TRIBUTE TO SHERMAN ROSE

Dothan resident, Sherman Rose was one of the first students and instructors of the Tuskeegee Institute's



civilian pilot training program for African-American pilots.





DOTHAN OPERA HOUSE

A tribute to the famed celebrities who performed on the Dothan Opera House stage.

SALUTE TO FT. RUCKER

Home to Army Aviation that began as a training camp for soldiers in WWII.

THE STEAMBOAT ERA

How the steamboat contributed to the success of the Wiregrass area prior to the railroad in 1889.



CHERRY STREET A.M.E. CHURCH

The oldest African Methodist Episcopal Church in Alabama.

WIREGRASS MUSIC

A three-part mural chronicling contemporary and country music artists with ties to the Wiregrass area.

EARLY COMMERCE IN THE WIREGRASS

A four-part mural depicting early industries in the Wiregrass area - turpentine, logging, cotton, and the railroad.

DANCING DAVE

A tribute to a Dothan legend, Dancing Dave, who would dance in the National Peanut Festival parade annually.

DR. CARVER

A mural dedicated to Dr. Carver and his contributions. This mural is located inside the Carver Museum.

WILDLIFE IN THE WIREGRASS

Depicting the natural wildlife and game found in the Wiregrass area.

WOMEN OF THE WIREGRASS

A tribute to the women who molded and shaped Dothan and the Wiregrass area.

HONORING WIREGRASS VETERANS

Based on an actual photo of the parade down Foster St. celebrating the end of WWII.









PEANUTS AROUND TOWN

What began as a fundraiser for the revitalization of Downtown Dothan has morphed into a city-wide public art project. Businesses purchase fiberglass peanut statues from locally owned Replica Plastics, and design them with significance to their business. You'll find Dothan legends, kangaroos, armadillos, chefs, superheroes, doctors, dogs, and even a giant chicken. As of this publication, there are 82 Peanuts Around Town, and more are being added daily. We dare you to find a more unique city signature than the Dothan Peanuts Around Town.

You'll need a vehicle for this scavenger hunt as the peanuts spread (pun intended) all over town. Scan the QR code and see if you can find them all! This is a great activity to learn your way around Dothan or to get the kids out of the house on a school holiday.



PERFORMING ARTS

The performing arts are alive and well in Dothan thanks to a colorful collection of theaters that includes the Southeast Alabama Community Theatre (SEACT), which was established in 1974. The theater stages four public productions per season, ranging from beloved classics such as Newsies, Big Fish and Chicago to Mama Won't Fly and other contemporary hits. SEACT also holds an annual Choral & Theatre Festival, which takes place each autumn.



PERFORMING ARTS

ALABAMA DANCE WORKS

ADW's top-tier talent performs multiple shows per year, including their much anticipated Halloween and Christmas performances.

CULTURAL ART CENTER

The Cultural Arts Center is dedicated to connecting the arts to the community through theatre, classes, and performances.

DOTHAN CIVIC CENTER & OPERA HOUSE

Dothan's largest entertainment venues, bring various live shows, concerts, and comedians to the area.

LIVE AT THE OPERA

Hosts live music events several times per year at various locations. Names have included John Paul White, Molly Tuttle, and Billy Strings.

THE PLANT

Originally built in 1942 as Dothan's Coca-Cola Bottling Plant it has since been renovated and serves as a unique venue to share live music and entertainment with the community.

SOUTHEAST ALABAMA COMMUNITY THEATER

Dothan's theater community comes together to establish Southeast Alabama Community Theatre, or SEACT. Presenting several shows per season, SEACT has been entertaining local audiences for years.

SOUTHEAST ALABAMA DANCE COMPANY

A premier dance company that performs three shows per year, including a local favorite- the annual performance of The Nutcracker each December.

TRI-STATE COMMUNITY ORCHESTRA

Composed of local musicians, this orchestra hosts several incredible performances annually. They can be found showcasing their talents at the Dothan Opera House, Landmark Park, and the Cultural Arts Center.
